

### Ronald L. Arenson, MD

President, Radiological Society of North America

### PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Going Boldly into Radiology's Technological Future: Why Our Profession Must Embrace Innovation

Ronald L. Arenson, MD, FACR, is the president of RSNA. Dr. Arenson is the Alexander R. Margulis Distinguished Professor and chair of the Department of Radiology and Biomedical Imaging at the University of California, San Francisco, where he has been since 1992. Dr. Arenson earned his medical degree in 1970 from New York Medical College in New York.



He completed his internship at Beth Israel Medical Center in New York and his diagnostic radiology residency at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Dr. Arenson began his academic career in 1976 at the University of Pennsylvania (Penn) after serving in the U.S. Navy at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland. During his tenure at Penn, Dr. Arenson was associate chairman of clinical services in radiology, director of administrative services and interim vice provost for information systems and computing. Dr. Arenson has authored or co-authored over 110 peer-reviewed scientific articles, four book chapters, three books and numerous exhibits, audiovisuals, abstracts, and editorials. He has served on the editorial boards of several journals, including Radiology, Investigative Radiology, Journal of Digital Imaging, Academic Radiology and Journal of the American College of Radiology, and has lectured at nearly 250 universities and institutes

A member of RSNA since 1974, Dr. Arenson has served on numerous committees, including the Publications Council, Education Council, Public Information Advisors Network, Research Development Committee and the Radiology Informatics Committee (formerly Electronic Communications Committee), serving as chairman from 1999 to 2005. In 2007, he was elected to the RSNA Board of Directors and has served as the Board liaison for the annual meeting and technology. He served as Board chairman from 2012 to 2013, and president-elect from 2013 to 2014.

### Darrell G. Kirch, MD

President & CEO, Association of American Medical Colleges

### SPECIAL LECTURE

Radiology, Medicine, and Healthcare: Will Inaction or Innovation Determine Our Future?

As AAMC president, Dr. Kirch speaks and publishes widely on transforming the nation's healthcare system and how academic medicine can lead that change through education, medical research and patient care. His career in academic medicine includes leadership positions at two medical schools and academic health systems, as well as at the National Institutes of



Health. Before becoming AAMC president in 2006, Dr. Kirch served as chair-elect of the association, and co-chaired the AAMC Liaison. Committee on Medical Education, the accreditation body for medical schools. He also chaired the AAMC Council of Deans Administrative Board and the American Medical Association Section on Medical Schools. He previously served as senior vice president for health affairs, dean of the college of medicine and CEO of the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center at Pennsylvania State University, and held several leadership positions at the Medical College of Georgia.

Jeffrey R. Immelt has held several global leadership positions since joining GE in 1982, including roles in plastics, appliances, and healthcare businesses. Mr. Immelt became a GE officer in 1989 and joined the GE Capital Board in 1997. He has served as GE's Chairman and CEO since 2001 Mr. Immelt has been named one of the World's Best CEOs three



times by Barron's. Since Mr. Immelt began serving as CEO, GE has been named "America's Most Admired Company" in a poll conducted by Fortune magazine and one of the World's Most Respected Companies in polls by Barron's and the Financial Times. In other roles, Mr. Immelt served as chair of President Obama's Council on Jobs and Competitiveness and as a member of the American Academy of Arts & Sciences.

### Presentation of Honorary Memberships

### Lorenzo Bonomo, MD

Rome, Italy

Currently a professor of radiology and chairman of the Department of Radiological Sciences at the Catholic University of Rome, Gemelli Hospital, Dr. Bonomo is also director of the university's training programme in radiology. He earned his medical degree at the Catholic University in Rome in 1970, where he completed his residency training program. He moved to



Chieti University, Italy, where he spent more than 25 years and helped establish the radiology department. After starting as associate professor and interim chairman in the Department of Radiology, he became a full professor and department chairman in 1990, staying until taking his current posts at Catholic University and Gemelli Hospital in 2003. From 1998 to 2003, Dr. Bonomo founded and directed a government breast screening program in Italy's Abruzzo region. From 1996 to 2003 he served as director of the Medical Programme of the University of Chieti. Parallel to his professional activities, Dr. Bonomo served as president of several radiologic organizations including the Italian Society of Thoracic Radiology from 1992 to 1996; the European Society of Thoracic Imaging (ESTI) from 1999 to 2000, and the First World Congress of Thoracic Imaging and Diagnosis in Chest Disease in 2005. He also received honorary membership from ESTI in 2006.

### Chamaree Chuapetcharasopon, MD Bangkok, Thailand

Dr. Chuapetcharasopon received her medical degree from Ramathibodi Hospital, Faculty of Medicine, Mahidol University, Bangkok, Thailand, in 1979. After six years in community hospitals, she completed residency training in general radiology at the same institute where her father served as dean of the medical school. She pursued a fellowship in vascular



and interventional radiology and body imaging at MD Anderson. After 10 years as an interventionist in medical school and private practice, Bumrungrad International Hospital recruited her to be the chief of the Department of Radiology. There, she successfully implemented the first totally digital radiology department in her native Thailand. In 2002, Dr. Chuapetcharasopon joined Bumrungrad International's administrative team as the associate medical director, rising to the position of medical director where she oversaw 1.000 medical staff members from 2008 to 2012. 



# Metra Electric Train System

#### Station Information

The McCormick Place Station is underground and accessible from the west side of the Grand Concourse-Level 2.5. Look for the Metra Information Desk near the entrance. Millennium Station is below ground on Michigan Avenue between South Water and Randolph Streets. Street level access is on Michigan Avenue at the southwest corner at Randolph Street, Access can also be made through the Prudential Building on Randolph Street.

The Van Buren/Jackson Street Station is below ground on Michigan Avenue between Jackson and Van Buren Streets. Street access is on Michigan Avenue at the northeast. northwest and southwest corners at Van Buren Street.






